Calcium chloride is produced from natural brine deposits found underground. It attracts moisture; this is what makes it an excellent dust control agent. SFG does NOT guarantee complete suppression of dust, because of weather, traffic and road conditions may affect the treated area. Two applications are highly recommended. It is dust control, not complete dust elimination.

Flags must be picked up at the Appanoose County Secondary Roads Shed ONLY. (These are the only approved stakes- any others will not be considered.) Flags must be in place from May 5th to October 1st. Flags should be placed approximately 6' from the edge of the road on the traffic side for easy visibility. Failure to maintain stakes may result in loss of dust control.

Our trucks are equipped with computer equipment that measures the exact footage being sprayed. If the flags are not set to the correct footage purchased we will go to the purchased footage. If the area is not marked by flags the driver will use their best judgment for the treated area.

Weather permitting we plan to apply dust control on/around May 19th - May 25th. The second application will be sprayed at the end of July/ early August. Anybody wishing two applications must apply for both by the deadline. Product SDS sheets are available upon request at Smith Fertilizer & Grain.

CUSTOMER RESPONSIBILITIES PER COUNTY

- 1) Appanoose County reserves the right to perform maintenance (such as blading and granular resurfacing) through areas of dust control to level uneven or rough areas, without liability for the cost of any new dust control application. All dust control applications will be graded after October 1st. Appanoose County Grader Operators will place rock AT THEIR DISCRETION ONLY.
2) Any person desiring to have dust control on a section of road under county jurisdiction shall be responsible for hiring an approved contractor.
3) The normal, minimal treatment available will be 300 linear feet with treatment being applied in one or two separate applications. Scheduling of these applications will be the responsibility of the resident- selected contractor in compliance with Appanoose County's request. Appanoose County may prepare the site prior to the application by the chosen contractor depending on the need to do so.
